NRC STAFF'S SUGGESTED AGENDA FOR LOW POWER SECURITY PROCEEDING

In a telephone conference on February 25, 1985, the Licensing Board asked the parties to suggest an outline of agenda points for the conference of counsel scheduled for February 28, 1985 and for the future course of the proceeding. The Staff believes the following items are appropriate for discussion:

- 1. The effect of ALAB-800 on this proceeding. Clearly the decision reversed and remanded the rejection of the contentions by the Board. The question remains as to what additional controlling effect the Appeal Board's decision has on this proceeding.
- 2. Exemption proceeding or compliance proceeding? This matter, in the Staff's view, is one for the utility to resolve: does LILCO wish to apply for an exemption pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 73.5 or does LILCO intend to demonstrate compliance with Fart 73?

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- 3. If LILCO pursues the exemption route, by what standard is the exemption application to be judged? Does CLI-84-8 apply, or does the traditional Staff practice apply?
- 4. Revision of contentions. Whether exemption proceeding or compliance proceeding, the Staff believes the Intervenors should be given the opportunity to revise their contentions in light of two developments: ALAB-800 and the agreement by LILCO to provide protection for the EMD's.
- 5. Scheduling of future proceedings.
