I regret that I cannot present polished data in support of my request that you deny a full power operating license for Philadelphia Electric's Limerick power station.

However, only a fool would accept the nebulous and essentially untested evacuation plans for Limerick. For example, I have lived in the Limerick area for many years and can attest that inadequate roads would quickly clog as they often do during minor winter storms, roadwork and rush hour traffic.

I have four children and have witnessed the stress of my parents who were required to leave the Middletown area after Three Mile Island.

You and I both know that Limerick was an ill-conceived sight with high density population and lack of a stable water supply. It would in all likelihood not be chosen as a sight with today's insights and public requirements for corporate responsibility.


