SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION REPORT 50-498/96-02; 50-499/96-02

This refers to the inspection conducted by Mr. D. P. Loveless, and the inspectors identified in the attached report, of this office on February 11, through March 23, 1996, at the South Texas Project, Units 1 and 2, facility. The purpose of the inspection was to determine whether activities authorized by the license were conducted safely and in accordance with NRC requirements. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with those members of your staff identified in the enclosed report.

Areas examined during the inspection are identified in the report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, inspection of installed equipment, interviews with personnel, and observation of activities in progress. The purpose of the inspection was to determine whether activities authorized by the license were conducted safely and in accordance with NRC requirements.

Based on the results of this inspection, an unresolved item was opened to further evaluate your current practice of addressing quadrant power tilt ratios during plant startup. Of concern is your practice of increasing reactor power above 50 percent with a quadrant power tilt ratio in excess of the Technical Specification limits without first reducing the power range nuclear instrument setpoints. This practice is currently under review by the NRC staff. In addition, the quadrant power tilt anomaly observed during power ascension appears to have become an expectation rather than an exception. However, this is contrary to Updated Final Safety Analysis Report statements that corrective action must be taken when the indicated quadrant power tilt ratio exceeds 1.02.

Also of concern was a reactor coolant system boron dilution event caused by the mispositioning of a throttle valve in the chemical addition system. This issue was dispositioned as a noncited violation in accordance with Section VII.B.1 of the NRC Enforcement Policy. It is our understanding that, during the exit meeting conducted on March 25, 1996, you agreed to complete a review of the controls governing the configuration of all manual throttle valves in the plant. If your understanding of this program enhancement differs from ours, please contact me immediately.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosure will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room.
