Dear Mr. President

My wife and I and most of my neighbors and friends voted for you and supported both your campaigns financially & vocally. We think you are doing a fine job but one thing we would like to bring to your attention is the way the NRC is dealing with the Silco Shoreham Nuclear plant on Long Island. Briefly they are considering exempting Silco from the diesel generators and back up system requirements for low power operation. They will not allow Suffolk County and N.Y. State to present oral arguments against Shoreham licensing. This is not democratic. I understand the NRC is

concerned about Libco's financial situation, If they are allowed to go on low power and then prevented from going on to full power they will have spent 70 million on wasted fuel. And how can they possibly ever go on full power without a safe evacuation plan which has been proven impossible.

Please Mr. President, we would appreciate your looking into this situation before it gets any worse and perpetuates the mistakes and waste that has already taken place here on T.I.
