Dear Mr. Gubler:

The White House has referred your letter to President Reagan to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission for reply. In regard to the Shoreham nuclear power plant, an Atomic Safety and Licensing Board which considered Long Island Lighting Company's application for a license authorizing fuel loading and low power testing has taken three actions which, in sum, approve the application subject to review by the Commission itself. The Commission, to date, has not acted on this matter and there is no indication when it might. Two other Atomic Safety and Licensing Boards are conducting public hearings on separate issues which must be decided before a decision can be made on the company's application for a full power operating licensee--offsite emergency planning and the adequacy of emergency diesel generators planned for use at the Shoreham site. Once the Licensing Boards have decided these matters, the Commission again will have to act before a full power license could issue.
