Dear Rep. Carney:

This letter is written to remind you of your responsibility to the citizens whom you represent.

We have been watching very closely, as I am sure you have been, the NRC hearings which have already begun on the proposed nuclear facility at Shoreham, Vt. The schedule which has been set for the hearings + the manner in which they will be handled (from the general attitude of the NRC at preliminary hearings) is as much as to say - we've already decided and this is just a formality. Derival of this

purpose by the NRC means absolutely - -
nothing at this point.

We are appalled at the lack of concern shown for the safety of L.D. citizens. If there is reason for the intervenors to object to the plant going on line, then we want to know about it before - not after. We demand that you, as our elected official, stand up for our rights + our safety before the NRC Chairman Palladino and protest the schedule. We demand a fair hearing for the intervenors, so that we may rest assured that if + when the plant goes into operation, it is safe. Also, we want to see a full physical ~~and~~ inspection done by - not Ldco or the NRC - but by an independent firm who is not a "friend of Ldco." Our future + yours is at stake here - Cordially, Gery Boneske
