Dear Congressman Carney.

We the people of Shoreham, have to unfortunately live well within the 2 mile danger zone of the Shoreham Nuclear Power Plant. I do understand that as a whole, our country is required to change to alternate sources of energy, and realize that the LILCO Plant will go on line some time next year. We can only hope and pray that there will not be a nuclear accident, where we would have to evacuate our property. And that is my question Sir. - Should we successfully be able to evacuate (which I doubt) and our property becomes contaminated, to a point where we could never move back again, may I ask, WHO will be responsible for our losses. - My Insurance company? NO. LILCO -? NO. Since the NRC gives final approval to go on line - I would think that the replacement of our losses, should be compensated by the US Government - Please let me know what your findings are, concerning this.
