This is a request under the Freedom of Information Act, as amended, 5 U.S.C. § 552. On behalf of the Joint Intervenors in the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant licensing proceeding (In the Matter of Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Nos. 50-275, 323), I am writing to request a copy of all records (10 C.F.R. 9.3a(b)) which discuss, relate to, arise out of, or address in any way the 1977 Nuclear Services Corporation audit of Pullman Power Products (also known as Pullman-Kellogg), the prime piping contractor for the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant. I, of course, reserve the right to appeal any decision to withhold information and expect that you will list the address and office to which such an appeal may be directed.
