As I expressed in my March 7, 1983 letter to you, the Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations of the Interior and Insular Affairs Committee is planning to hold a series of hearings on emergency preparedness. The series will consist of three field hearings and one wrap-up hearing in Washington, D.C., in the coming months.

I would very much like you and your fellow Commissioners to attend the first of these hearings. The hearing will take place on Long Island, New York, on April 18, 1983. The scope of the hearing will include how the regulatory process has addressed the problems of evacuating the area surrounding the Shoreham Nuclear Plant and regulatory issues concerning the utility, the NRC, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, and the state and local officials involved. My staff will be available to talk with your staff in more detail about the exact scope of the hearing.

I want you to know that I am very sensitive to the fact that this facility is the subject of ongoing legal proceedings. I want to assure you that questions regarding such contested issues will not be asked of you or the other Commissioners. However, at the same time, I want to emphasize the importance of your participation at this hearing.

The issues involved raise questions about the adequacy of the NRC's regulations and about tht agency's willingness to abide by those regulations. Hence, I think that it is
