
Dear Ms. Brosius:

This is a partial response to your letter dated April 13, 1984, in which you requested, pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, copies of documents which pertain to three categories of information regarding Wolf Creek Nuclear Power Plant.

The two documents listed on the Appendix are already available in the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Public Document Room (PDR), 1717 H Street, NW, Washington, DC 20555. You may request copies of these documents by referring to the accession numbers. There is no charge for inspecting records maintained at the PDR. The charge for copying records maintained at the PDR is five cents (\$0.05) per page, as specified in 10 CFR 9.14(a). If you do not wish to visit the PDR to inspect or copy these records, you may obtain a copy by calling (202-634-3273) or writing directly to the PDR. Upon your agreement to pay the copying charges, the PDR will arrange for the records to be copied by a private contractor servicing the PDR. You will be billed by the private contractor for copying charges, plus tax and postage.

The search for and review of additional documents subject to your request have not been completed. As soon as the search and review are completed, we will advise you of our disclosure determination.

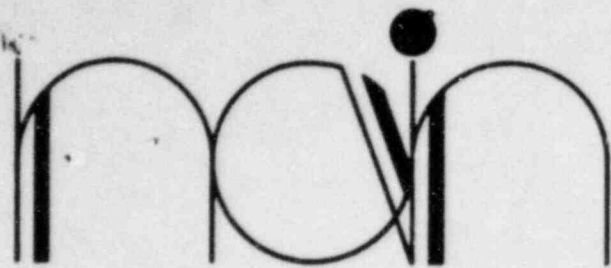

The documents are specifically requested from, but not limited to, the following offices of the NRC: Office of the Analysis and Evaluation of Operational Data (AEOD); Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR); Office of Nuclear Regulatory Research (Research); Office of Inspection and Enforcement (I&E); Generic Issues Branch of the Division of Safety Technology, and the Operating Reactors Branches of the division of Licensing. In your response, please identify which documents correspond to which requests below.

Pursuant to this request, please provide all documents prepared or utilized by, in the possession of, or routed through the NRC related to:

1. Any and all Office of Investigation (OI) investigations, completed and ongoing.
2. Any and all OI Auditor reports concerning Wolf Creek or licensees.
3. Any and all "Systems Turnover", completed and ongoing.

If any of the material covered by this request has been destroyed and/or removed, please provide all surrounding documentation, including but not limited to a description of the action(s) taken, relevant date(s), and justification(s) for the actions.
