

Dr. Alan Kalischer served as a nuclear cardiology fellow at Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center from July, 1981 through June, 1982. During this time, he was involved in the performance and interpretation of first pass, gated blood pool, pyrophosphate, and Thallium studies.
