The Illinois Department of Nuclear Safety has evaluated your request dated November 15, 1994, for an exception to the 100 mrem/yr dose limit specified in 32 Ill. Admin. Code Section 340.310(a)(2)(B). In conducting this evaluation, Department personnel evaluated Kerr-McGee's environmental monitoring data for 1994 and 1995 as well as corresponding data from the Department's Office of Environmental Safety, environmental monitoring network. As part of this evaluation, these data were extrapolated to consider a reasonable exposure scenario. The results of this evaluation conclude that the dose limit is currently being met and therefore there is no need for an exception to the rule. As such, I hereby deny your request for an exception to the dose limit requirement. If you disagree with this determination, you may respond with additional justification and documentation, otherwise, no further response is necessary or expected.
