Gentlemen:

This refers to the inspection conducted by Mr. E. Epstein of this office on July 29, 1975 of activities authorized by NRC License No. 37-00611-09 and SUB-868 and to the discussions of our findings held by Mr. Epstein with yourself and Mr. Boyko of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

The inspection was an examination of activities conducted under your licenses as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and the conditions of your licenses. The inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, measurements made by the inspector, and observations by the inspector.

Our inspector also verified the steps you have taken to correct the items of noncompliance brought to your attention in a letter dated September 26, 1974. We have no further questions regarding your action at this time.

Within the scope of this inspection, no items of noncompliance were observed.



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
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
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
