Dear Ms. Dicus:

As required by 44 CFR 350.9(d), this letter provides official notice that FEMA's evaluation of the June 24, 1992 Radiological Emergency Preparedness Exercise at Arkansas Nuclear One, Russellville, Arkansas identified a Deficiency related to Plume Dose Projection (FEMA Exercise Objective #7) and the resulting Protective Action Advisories issued from the State Emergency Operating Facility (SEOF).

As defined in FEMA REP 14, dated September 1991, a Deficiency is an observed or identified inadequacy of organizational performance in an exercise that could cause a finding that offsite emergency preparedness is not adequate to provide reasonable assurance that appropriate protective measures can be taken in the event of a radiological emergency to protect the health and safety of the public living in the vicinity of a nuclear power plant.

The Deficiency resulted from the omission of a recommendation to evacuate Protective Action Zone (PAZ) "T" in Yell County from Protective Action Advisory (PAA) \$4, issued at 10:52 a.m., and from PAA \$4 Amended, issued at 11:25 a.m., and the failure of the SEOF's three-level check system to identify this omission. The omission was detected and evacuation of PAZ "T" was finally recommended in PAA \$5 issued at 12:44 p.m., more than two hours after the recommendation for the evacuation of all other portions of Yell County within the Emergency Planning Zone (EPZ).

Based on the exercise observations described above, the cited Deficiency will require that corrective action be undertaken, and appropriate corrections demonstrated, within 120 days of the June 24, 1992 exercise.

FEMA Region VI believes that this Deficiency can be resolved by a Remedial Drill which would demonstrate the SEOF's capability to develop and implement accurate PAAs.

You are herewith requested to provide a written response to this notice of a Deficiency finding, by July 15, 1992 outlining the proposed corrective actions that will be undertaken to resolve this issue. If you feel that a special meeting is required to discuss specific solutions to this issue, please advise me in your response.
