Gentlemen:

This refers to the inspections conducted by Messrs. R. R. Keimig, T. E. Vandell, W. A. Crossman on February 18-20, 1975; L. W. Gage on March 26, 1975, and M. W. Dickerson and R. R. Keimig on April 2-4, 1975, of the implementation of your quality assurance program related to your application for a construction permit for Wolf Creek 1, and to the discussion of our findings held by the inspectors with members of your staff at the conclusion of each inspection.

Areas examined during the inspections and our findings are discussed in the enclosed inspection report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examination of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations by the inspectors.

During the inspection, it was found that your quality assurance program was deficient in that certain activities appeared not to meet the requirements of Appendix B to 10 CFR 50 of the NRC Regulations, 'Quality Assurance Criteria for Nuclear Power Plants.' The items and references to the pertinent requirements are identified in Section I of the summary of the enclosed report.

Please provide us within 30 days, in writing, with your comments concerning these items, a description of any steps that have been or will be taken to correct them, a description of any steps that have been or will be taken to prevent recurrence, and the date all corrective actions or preventive measures will be completed.

We have also examined actions you have taken with regard to previously identified unresolved items. The status of these items is identified in Section IV of the summary of the enclosed report.



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In accordance with Section 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice", Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, a copy of this letter and the enclosed inspection report will be placed in the NRC's Public Document Room. If this report contains any information that you believe to be proprietary, it is necessary that you submit a written application to this office, within 20 days of the date of this letter, requesting that such information be withheld from public disclosure. The application must include a full statement of the reasons why it is claimed that the information is proprietary. The application should be prepared so that any proprietary information identified is contained in an enclosure to the application, since the application without the enclosure will also be placed in the Public Document Room. If we do not hear from you in this regard within the specified period, the report will be placed in the Public Document Room.

Should you have any questions concerning this inspection, we will be glad to discuss them with you.
