Dear Gentleperson:

I feel that failure to hold public hearings or the storage of radioactive waste at this facility and the continued generation of more is totally irresponsible.

When nuclear power plants were first built the industry knew that there would be massive amounts of radioactive waste generated but they felt that a solution to this situation would be found before it became a problem. This is like getting into an airplane without knowing how to land it. We have reached the point were the plane can no longer fly and we haven't even invented the parachute.

There is NO long term disposal method for the nuclear waste we are now generating. The Dry Cask system proposed for __Palisades has not been tested under the climatic conditions

9209080047 920812 PDR PR 72 57FR28645 PDR of a West Michigan winter. Plans for monitoring and dealing with a possible failure of the cask have been minimazed.

The cost effectiveness of nuclear power only seems to exist when the cost of the disposal of waste is ignored.

I feel that the only rational procedure is to close this plant unless a better long term disposal system is found. Burying it in Nevada or sticking it in a box is not a way of solving the problem.
