SUBJECT: SECY-92-303 - METRICATION POLICY

The Commission (with all Commissioners agreeing) has disapproved the staff's proposed policy statement which would permit the English or metric (SI) units to be listed first depending on the system in which the original value of the parameter was derived. The policy statement should be revised to be consistent with the January 8, 1992 SRM on SECY-91-390 which stated: "The staff should modify the proposed policy statement such that the English units are provided in brackets after the use of the International System of Units (SI) since the SI system has been mandated by Congress to be the preferred system of weights and measures for U.S. trade and commerce."

The Commission (with all Commissioners agreeing) has approved the staff's position that English units should be used for emergency response communications and that licensee specific communications should be in the units of the licensee's system. The use of the vernacular for individual licensee communications is also appropriate since it is the spirit of the law that market forces should drive an individual licensee's choice of units, not non-safety related regulation.

The Commission Metrification Policy Statement should contain the following elements: 1) generic communications should be written using the convention of metric first followed by bracketed English units; 2) emergency communications should be written in English units; and 3) licensee specific communications be written in the units of the individual licensee.
