I had made arrangements in September/October of 199 with a credicor for an out-of-court-settlement of their claim, satisfied by the nuclear gauges. Unfortunately, their NRC license did not come through when expected. I did not have the money to pay for proper disposal through a company authorized to perform that task, and it took some time for me to find someone who would accept the equipment. I was in contact with your agency during this time, and the gentleman with whom I spoke in your agency was very understanding. He said that he knew I was trying to dispose of the gauges, and that there would be no fees levied against me. I think he was from your Tennessee office. Your invoice caught me by surprise.
