Mr. Weiss:

I received your letter dated August 24, 1992, just this Thursday, the 10th of September, 1992.

Earth Technology Company, Inc. is no longer in business and its' creditors (mostly the IRS) have taken its' assets.

I, personally, received notice of bankruptcy discharge September 11, 1991. I am now employed part-time as a clerk being paid at an hourly rate of \$5.50.

I had made arrangements in September/October of 1991 with a creditor for an out-of-court-settlement of their claim, satisfied by the nuclear gauges. Unfortunately, their NRC license did not come through when expected. I did not have the money to pay for proper disposal through a company authorized to perform that task, and it took some time for me to find someone who would accept the equipment.

I was in contact with your agency during this time, and the gentleman with whom I spoke in your agency was very understanding. He said that he knew I was trying to dispose of the gauges, and that there would be no fees levied against me. I think he was from your Tennessee office. Your invoice caught me by surprise.

I would like to resolve your invoice amicably. Neither I, nor Earth Technology, have much, but please consider accepting my offer of \$350.00 to close the claim.
