

Dear Ted,

Thank you for sending me a copy of your letter to the U S Nuclear Regulatory Commission, regarding the permit application of Wyoming Fuel Company, to construct a pilot plant for in situ uranium solution mining. My staff assistant also told me of your telephone call regarding hearings and a possible environmental impact statement before an NRC license is issued. I would like to briefly reiterate the steps in the permit process and where the Wyoming Fuel Company's permit is, in the process.

As you know, the NRC cannot issue a license for an uranium mining Research & Development project until the state issues its permit. The Nebraska Department of Environmental Control is holding its hearing on the project in September. The Denver NRC office has received a request for public hearings on the proposed license. This material is being sent to the NRC office here in Washington. Once received, the licensing board will review the request and determine whether an NRC public hearing is necessary.

Of course, before any NRC license can be issued, an environmental impact analysis (EIA) must be done, to determine if the project will have a significant environmental impact. If so, an environmental impact statement (EIS) must be done. Drilling for water samples can be done before the license and environmental analysis is done. However, no chemical can be injected into the groundwater until the NRC license is obtained.

To make sure that all your concerns are completely and accurately answered, I have forwarded a copy of your letter to the NRC. As soon as I receive their reply, I will send it on to you.
