Dear Mr. Orlikowski,

Cardinal Health 414, LLC (hereafter Cardinal Health) submitted a request to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (hereafter NRC) dated April 30, 2020 for regulatory relief during the COVID-19 PHE for 10 CFR Part 20.2206(c).

The previous letter referenced six radioactive materials licenses issued to Cardinal Health by the NRC as being impacted by this situation. However, upon review of 10 CFR 20.2206(a)(7), only two of the licenses are licensed to possess radioactive materials meeting or exceeding the threshold quantities listed in that section of the regulation and are therefore required to submit individual dosimetry data to the REIRS program under the requirements of this part.

The two affected licenses are the following:

- 34-29200-01MD
- 34-31473-02MD

Cardinal Health therefore withdraws the request for the other licenses listed in the April 30 letter and not listed above, as these licenses are not subject to reporting requirements.
