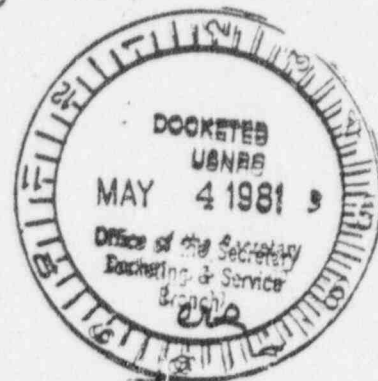

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saddled with the bill.

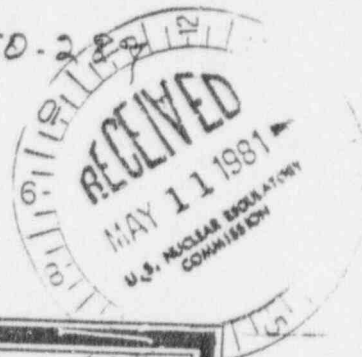
I am angry. Angry that you would jeopardize generations of humanity. When God gave this earth to man, he gave us the responsibility to preserve and protect the land and air.

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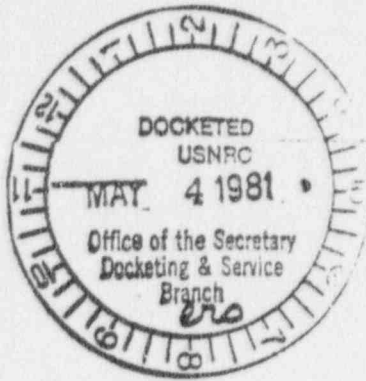
too. We all live with too many gadget

Dear Mr. Ahearne,

We are most concerned
by the dangerous and lengthy
clean up that is still to be
done two years after the
accident at Three Mile Island.

We urge you not to
allow Unit 1, the twin of the
damaged reactor, to be restarted
until all potential problems

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have been solved. Many experts
have testified at your hearings
that this plant should not be
restarted. Their expert opinions
should be given most serious
consideration. And, of course,
the request by the president
of General Public Utilities to
allow the plant to restart before
the hearings are completed should
not be granted.
