register my concern with the
purposed permit to NSP for
the releasing of radioactive
discharges into the Mississippi
river from the Monticello
Nuclear Plant.

Both Dr. Charles Haver

and Dr. Maurice Vischel

of the University of
Minnesota state that
radioactive discharges from
this plant will raise the

level of radioactivity in
the drinking water of the
town cities higher than the
maximum allowed by the
World Health Organization.
Surely it would be
inexcusable to allow this.

In case of an
accident in the power
plant it is possible to
shut the ~~is~~ Pond
water supply off at
Fildes but this would
not safeguard NPLs.
which has no alternative
supply.

Injurious effects from

the Columbia river have
begun to be noticed. These
cumulative ecological
buildups should be
thoroughly understood before
the Mississippi is allowed
to become further polluted.
