ORDER RECOGNIZING AND PERMITTING LIMITED APPEARANCES

- 1. At the prehearing conference in Buffalo, Minnesota on April 7, 1970, the board dealt with requests for limited appearances. - 4. The board reserves its right under 2.715(a) to set at the hearing such limits and conditions upon the making of any limited appearance as it may deem appropriate at that time.
- 5. The limited appearance statements under §2.715(a) will be scheduled after the board attends to preliminary matters and announcements at the beginning of the hearing. The statements, which will take place prior to the time the parties introduce evidence, may be expected to begin late in the morning of the first day of the hearing and continue into the afternoon. This projection of the timing of that part of the hearing schedule pertaining to limited appearances is an estimate only for the convenience of those concerned; it should not be construed otherwise.
- statements are encouraged to forward such statements to the board chairman in care of the Public Proceedings Branch, U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, Washington, D.C. 20545 so that they arrive on or before Thursday, April 23, 1970. In the normal course of events, the statements would then be duplicated and distributed to the parties and others on the certificate of service list prior to the hearing. From the standpoint of orderly proceedings it is desirable that the parties in particular be informed in advance of the hearing of the substance of the limited appearance statements.

7. As previously noticed, the hearing is scheduled to begin at 10:00 a.m., local time, on April 28, 1970 at Courtroom 4 (7th floor) in the United States Federal Courthouse, 316 North Roberts Street, St. Paul, Minnesota.
