Gentlemen:

This refers to your letter of March 1, 1957, requesting an extension of time for your compliance with the requirements of 10 CFR 20, the AEC regulation "Standards For Protection Against Radiation".

In order for the Commission to consider exempting you from any of the requirements of Part 20, it is necessary that you indicate the specific section or sections of the regulation from which you are requesting exemption, the circumstances surrounding your operations which lead you to apply for such an exemption, and the manner and extent to which you propose to deviate from the provisions of the regulation.

You should also clearly specify the alternative measures by which you propose to accomplish the basic objective of the regulation to limit the exposure of individuals to radiation doses and concentrations of radioactive materials to those values specified in Section 20.101, 10 CFR 20.

We gather from your letter that you feel that you are already in substantial compliance with the above-mentioned regulation. For our part we would be reluctant to grant a blanket exemption from the entire regulation. It is for this reason that we would like you to furnish us the information specified above.
