This letter is in reference to your corporation's inactive Rare Earth Division facility which is located in West Chicago, Illinois.

On June 22, 1976, representatives of our Department met with Messrs. Ralph J. Vreeland and Rey McLean of your corporation to discuss the current status of the West Chicago facility. This discussion contered principally around your proposed decommissioning efforts with the U.S. Huclear Regulatory Commission and the present radioactive contamination problems that exist at this facility.

Complaints from the public, living adjacent to the site, have been referred to this Department concerning airborne discharges of materials from the site to off-site locations during high wind conditions, and unauthorised entry onto the site by children and pets resulting in unauthorized removal of materials from the site.

Initial visual inspection of the site and preliminary enroys of eff-site locations by Department personnel indicate that the site security is inadequate and that material is being discharged to eff-site locations. I am, therefore, requesting that Kerr McGes take immediate action to upgrade site security of as to preclude all unauthorized entry to the site and provide interim stablization of en-site materials so as to preclude discharges to eff-site areas until such time as final disposition of all en-site radioactive waste materials has been accomplished. 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I have directed my staff to initiate in depth surveillance of the site to determine the extent of the radiological impact to the public and to investigate acceptable methods for decommissioning.
