Per your request, A. W. Holmes, this office, will provide assistance in the inspection of the subject licensee, during the week of April 17, 1961. Mr. Holmes will be forwarding, by express, the necessary equipment to your office during the first of the coming week.

Mr. Holmes will be leaving Idaho Falls, via Western Flight 25 and United Flight 726, April 16, 1961, arriving at O'Hare Field at 7:55 p.m. It would be appreciated if you would arrange for transportation from O'Hare Field or suggest the best travel method from O'Hare to wherever he might best stay Sunday evening.

Sunday

As I recall from my previous visit to Lindsay two or three years ago, the Lindsay plant is rather extensive and will probably require the major part of the week to thoroughly sample airborne contamination, particularly if the early part of the week will be devoted to reviewing the Licensee's records. At Wendell's suggestion, I should like to recommend either of two alternatives to best utilize his time during the week. Wendell would much prefer to stay, after Sunday evening, in the West Chicago area, rather than to commute to and from the ANL area. If your representative would agree to do likewise, this would provide ample opportunity for Wendell to work the required long hours when continuous sampling of a particular area appears warranted. Should your representative prefer to travel from his home each day, it would then be appreciated if you could arrange to have an additional car available for Wendell's use to allow for his early arrival and/or late departure from the plant. He is most desirous of being at the Lindsay plant by 8 o'clock each morning and of being able to work until at least 5 o'clock each evening, when necessary.

It would be appreciated if you would let Wendell know as soon as possible what arrangements will be made for him for Sunday evening.
