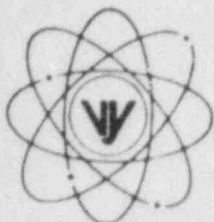

Subject: Site Access for NRC Inspectors

Dear Sir:

An agreement between Region I and Vermont Yankee made earlier this year [References (b) and (c)] prescribes that NRC inspectors may obtain unescorted access to the Vermont Yankee plant after receiving the 1-1/2 hour GET program, provided that the NRC inspector had received the generic GET prior to his/her arrival at Vermont Yankee. A letter sent to Vermont Yankee from your office listing those persons who have received your training normally precedes the inspectors' arrival.

To ensure that your inspectors receive their training in a timely manner, these access letters need to be received by our Training Department prior to the inspectors' arrival. Consequently, please add Mr. Stephen P. Skibniowsky, Plant Training Supervisor, to the distribution list for these access letters.
