To whom it may concern:

- 1. This was a violation for using nuclear densiometers in an NRC state without proper forms (Form 241).
- 2. We have ceased operation in the NRC state.
- 3. All personnel have been notified that use of the gauges in an NRC state is a violation. We have requested and have received both NRC Forms 241 and 313, and are deciding which avenue to take.
- 4. We are now in compliance, as we have ceased use of the gauges in the NRC state. We anticipate having the proper license in the next few months. This will depend on the amount of work and the date it will start. Gauges are utilized for checking soil compaction in the construction industry and currently we have no jobs requiring their use. We are bidding for work this summer and will know soon what our work load will be.
