SHOW CAUSE STATEMENTS

Show cause statements required in accordance with Section E of Appendix D, 10 CFR 50, have been received from the four materials licensees affected. We have attempted to evaluate the incremental impact on the environment that could result from the continuation of construction or operation of these plants until such time as the full environmental review required under NEPA can be completed. We find that there are deficiencies in the information submitted for each case which prevents us from completing our evaluation.

The status of each case is discussed in the enclosure.

STATUS OF SHOW CAUSE STATEMENTS

Maya-100 Licensee

Allied-Well Head Recovery Plant. Allied-Well has issued a construction permit on December 18, 1976. The plant is currently in the early stages of construction with completion expected by the summer of 1977. The applicant expects to complete design and set up wells for the main structure over the next six months while the tank structure awaits its being connected. The show cause statement for deferrals to this license did not fully explain the economic impact of suspending operations until completion of the NUREG review. We have been in touch with Allied-Well on this point and they provided further information within the past few days.

Iron Mountain plutonium oxide handling facility. The licensee's license application has been in operation since January 1971. The show cause statement was defective in that it did not provide quantitative information about the incremental environmental impact of operating over the next six months and the economic impact of closing the mill until completion of the full NUREG review. We have been in touch with the licensee about these deficiencies and expect further information within the next few days.

Kerr-McGee Plutonium Fuel Fabrication Plant. The plutonium fuel fabrication plant has been in operation since April 1970. The plant went into operation before we required any environmental report under the old ground rules. The licensee's show cause statement is very superficial and does not serve as a basis for reaching any conclusion about the incremental environmental impact or the economic impact of suspending operations during the period necessary to complete a NUREG review. Part of this problem is attributable to there not being an existing environmental report upon which we can make a comparative analysis. We believe it will be necessary to meet with the licensee to explain in some detail the type of information which will be necessary to reach a decision about the show cause statement. Since the licensee has a plant in operation and has had no prior experience with our NUREG requirements, we believe it is appropriate to meet with the licensee within the next few days to discuss what we will need and require supplemental information within the next ten days.

Kerr-McGee UFG Production Plant. The UFG production plant has been in operation since February 1970. Its status with respect to the show cause statement is the same as described above for the Kerr-McGee Plutonium Fuel Plant. We recommend the same course of action.
