SUBJECT: INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT WITH PACIFIC GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY DOCKET NOS. 50-133, 70-653

This supplements my memorandum of May 1, 1963 to the files, same subject.

Amendment No. 5 to License No. DPR-7 was issued effective December 3, 1963 and authorized an increase in the power levels up to 230 Mwt for a period of 15 days. To conform with 10 CFR 140,12 the financial protection required of Pacific Gas & Electric Company increases to \$41.4 million. Proof of such financial protection was received in the form of a telegram from NELIA advising us that such increase was effective December 4, 1963. In view of the difference of one day between the effective date of the license amendment and the effective date of the increase in financial protection, PG&E was advised by wire that the increase to the higher power level should not take place until December 4,

At the higher power level authorized, the indemnity fee goes to \$6,900 per year.

As the license amendment is for a test period only, the indemnity agreement will shortly be further amended to reflect a return to operations at a power level of 165 Mwt.

Pacific Gas & Electric Company is in compliance with the terms of 10 CFR Part 140 and the amendment is accordingly being issued.
