



Dear Sir:

As representatives of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, employed by the Westinghouse Electric Corporation at its Specialty Metals Division near Blairsville, Pa., we request your attention to our concerns regarding current implementation of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Act (NNPA).

We are in the nuclear heat transfer tube manufacturing business, processing Inconel and Zircaloy products for use in steam generators and nuclear fuel assemblies for commercial power stations, world-wide.

Our 600 people are 50% dependent on export business and are concerned about our long term job security, based on the significant delays taking place in the issuance of necessary export licenses.

At present, through conversations with our management, and our own investigation, we know of delays on product clearances on activity on Korea Units 3 and 4, Taiwan Units 5 and 6, the Philippines, Yugoslavia (KRSKO), and Spain (Sayago and Almaraz units).

We've worked long and hard to become the world's largest and highest quality producer in our industry and feel we are being overlooked in the politics being played in Washington on these issues.

We are already losing orders because our customers, even our long-standing French and Japanese customers, are afraid to place business with us, for fear they'll never get a permit to get it out of the United States. This is disgusting, and disheartening to us.

We want to know where you stand on supporting us and what you're doing to get some sensible policies set to save and build jobs for us.

Our frustrations at being the best in the world in our business, and being overlooked by our customers, because they do not trust our government policies, are building every day.

Please--tell us when we can get some support. --Will you help us and will you let us know what more we can do to help ourselves.


