Homestake Mining Company

Assessment of the comments on the DES continued. Scheduling of the FES cannot be done until the status of inputs required from other (Homestake, state, Forest Service) is established.

White Mesa

The PDES (in complete DES format) was completed in October. Mats, mag-cards, and copies were sent to NRC Wednesday 1 November 1978. The EPM and ORNL staff spent the week of 23 October reviewing the PDES and all changes were incorporated in the copy sent to NRC.

Shootering Canyon

Some sections have been edited and word processed to mag-cards. Major sections not done in draft form are 3 (Operations), 4 (Environmental impacts), and 10 (Alternatives). This slide is caused by total staff involvement in White Mesa. Every effort will be made to expedite this project in November.

Below Grade Burial - Morton Ranch

One ORNL staff member attended the national meeting of the Association of Engineering Geologists in order to maintain this area of work at the state-of-the-art concerning tailings disposal. Contact and coordination with Colorado State Consultants was maintained and the Shootering Canyon tailings disposal program was reviewed.

No meaningful completion cost but it is estimated at 10-15K/month as long as such services are required.

(b) General charges cover items in support of branch which are short term and not specific to single projects. Examples: summer student studies on tailings seepage, solution mining conference attendance, and general involvement in the environmental areas of uranium fuel cycle related activities. Estimates to vary between 0 to 6% of monthly project costs.
