

Meeting Summary: A meeting was held in NRC's Region I office to discuss the future decommissioning activities necessary to confirm that Gamma Industries' Port Norris, New Jersey facility meets current NRC criteria for release for unrestricted use.

2.0 Summary

Dr. Bellamy opened the meeting with a brief description of the current status of the facility; both the licensing and decommissioning status were described. Mr. Shaffer discussed the recent surveys that had been done to determine the current radiological status of the facility. He further stated that the results of these surveys did not substantiate that the facility meets current NRC criteria for release for unrestricted use. Messrs. Rush, Acree, and Parker requested that the NRC describe what was being requested of Gamma Industries with regards to releasing the site and how the NRC would verify these actions. General discussions were held covering the entire decommissioning process from characterization to confirmatory surveys.

The Gamma Industries representatives presented a general outline of how they intended to finish decommissioning the facility. Specific questions were asked regarding required authorizations and NRC involvement in the process. It was agreed the outline presented appeared to be acceptable and that a written version of the decommissioning process would be submitted to the NRC by June 30, 1997.

The meeting was adjourned.
