In the period between now and April, 1988, ANC proposes to cover Tailings Pond No. 1 and construct ditches along the east and west sides, approximately as shown on the attached "1987-1988 Interim Stabilization Plan". The ditches will have sufficient size and slope to catch the water draining off the side-slopes which now enters the pond. The dike will be reduced in height to allow drainage off the dike end from the top of the covered tailings. The surface of the pond would then be covered with enough material to establish positive drainage from the top of the pond to the ditches on the side or over the dire. The cover material would come from the sides of the pond, from the dike, and from the adjacent spoil pile. When this is completed, there will be no exposed tailings remaining, all tailings will be covered with six (6) inches or more of cover material and the ponding on the surface of the tailings will be eliminated.

The work on the mill will continue with the removal of the scale and scale house, and the dismantling of the crushing plant and building.

It is estimated that the work we have already accomplished this year plus the wall we hope to complete by April, 1988 coupled with the savings of the unnecessary work which has been eliminated and the 15% contingency sums associated with these items will total \$236,662. A break down of the \$236,662 is as follows:

The ditch work should start almost immediately because it will be necessary even if we are to receive the Riverton tailings into Pond No. 1. The covering of the pond would be delayed until there is a final determination on the Riverton tailings project.

As we discussed American plans to use a portion of the excess funds we requested to be released from its "cash" reclamation bond for this purpose. Accordingly, we request that the excess funds be released from the bond as soon as possible.
