Dear Sirs:

On April 12, 1988, Gregory Berry of our staff received a call from Thomas Scarbrough of your staff, inquiring whether the Seabrook Final Safety Analysis Report (FSAR) was in the record in this proceeding. An examination of the record indicates that the complete Report was not introduced into evidence. The provisions of FSAR section 8.3.1.4 (at 8.3-40), which the Staff cited at p. 3 of its brief, were introduced as part of Exhibit 9, Enclosure 2, to the filed testimony of Applicants' witnesses, ff. Tr. 357 (September 30, 1986). However, it does not appear that material cited in Staff's brief on the color coding of safety and non-safety-related cables which is in FSAR section 8.3.1.3 (at 8.3-39), was introduced into evidence. The complete FSAR was filed in the Commission's public document rooms and available to all parties. The transcript also indicated that the Licensing Board, to the knowledge of all parties, was supplied with a copy of the FSAR. Tr. 95-96 (May 6, 1982).

The Staff believes that since this document is not presently in the record, the record should be reopened by this Board to receive the cited portions of that document and give all parties the opportunity to object to the genuineness and the significance of those portions of the Final Safety Analysis Report.

The Staff apologizes for failing to realize at the time it prepared and filed its brief that the complete Report was only part of the agency's records, and not part of the record in this proceeding.
