RESPONSE TO NRC COMMENTS 1992 Program Review

1. Administrative Procedures

NRC recommends that certain established written policies and procedures be reviewed. NRC suggests shortening the time allowed for completing terminations, adding a checklist that documents verification of the final disposition of radioactive material prior to terminating a license, and developing a procedure or rating system to more precisely define when not to use the Field Form and when to consider escalated action.

Response: These suggestions are very reasonable and staff will make the necessary changes.

2. Inspection Reports

NRC recommends that all inspection report forms and formats should provide clear areas for the inspector to document all components of the inspection.

Response: Staff will proceed with updating several infrequently used report forms as well as developing a special follow-up inspection report format that will include the inspection components NRC determined to be missing.
