SUBJECT: MEETING WITH PUGET SOUND POWER AND LIGHT COMPANY - STATUS

OF ONGOING GEOLOGICAL EXPLORATION NEAR PROPOSED SKAGIT

SITE - NOVEMBER 6, 1978

Background:

By letter, dated June 16, 1978, we requested that Puget Sound Power and Light Company provide us with additional information regarding the geology of the proposed S'agit site region. This request resulted from concerns expressed by the USGS as the NRC staff consultant. This additional information required a considerable amount of additional field exploration in the region of the proposed site. The field exploration has been going on since the request.

The purpose of this meeting was to provide the applicant an opportunity to present the staff and USGS with a status report and projected schedules for completing the work and submitting the applicant's interpretation of the data. The meeting agenda and attendance list are enclosed.

Summary:

The applicant described the purpose of the ongoing field exploration and presented an overview of the work in progress. A number of technical presentations were made on the status of core drillings in the Cultus and Haystack Mountain area about six miles south of the proposed Skagit site. These core drillings are an attempt to resolve the question of whether the thrust fault is northward or southward dipping at the contact between the Darrington phyllites and the Chilliwack Group rocks.

Additional areomagnetic surveys of denser localized coverage were also performed to better define the fault contact between the Darrington phyllite and Chilliwack Group rocks. These surveys were also described in the applicant's presentation.

The potential for faulting along the Gilligan and Day Creek lineaments was also discussed.

The applicant described additional field work which had been done independently (not at staff request) in the Lake Cavanaugh area as a followup to USGS Regional field work done in that area.

The applicant was optimistic at the time of the meeting that field exploration has failed to support the existance of faulting in the proposed site area. He plans to file a response to the staff's request shortly after the first of the year (January or February 1979) and may file information on the Lake Cavanaugh work earlier.
