SAFETY EVALUATION BY THE OFFICE OF NUCLEAR REACTOR REGULATION

RELATED TO AMENDMENT NO. 130 TO DPR-65

NORTHEAST NUCLEAR ENERGY COMPANY, ET AL.

MILLSTONE NUCLEAR POWER STATION, UNIT NO. 2

DOCKET NO. 50-336

INTRODUCTION

By application for license amendment dated April 25, 1988, Northeast Nuclear Energy Company, et al. (the licensee), requested a change to Technical Specifications (TS) 3.4.4, "Pressurizer," for Millstone Unit 2. The proposed change to the TS would require that the 130KW of operable pressurizer heaters be, "...capable of being supplied by emergency power."

DISCUSSION AND EVALUATION

The requirement in TS 3.4.4 that 130KW of pressurizer heaters, capable of being supplied by emergency power, be operable, had previously been incorporated in the Millstone Unit 2 TS. In the course of issuing License Amendment No. 97 on August 24, 1984, the words "...capable of being supplied by emergency power" were inadvertently deleted. The proposed change to the TS would correct the error introduced with issuance of License Amendment No. 97. Correction of the error associated with TS 3.4.4 has no other effect on the TS or operation of Millstone Unit 2. Accordingly, the proposed change to the TS is acceptable.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATION

This amendment is administrative in nature. Accordingly, the amendment meets the eligibility criteria for categorical exclusion set forth in 10 CFR §51.22(c)(10). Pursuant to 10 CFR §51.22(b), no environmental impact statement or environmental assessment need be prepared in connection with the issuance of the amendment.

CONCLUSION

We have concluded, based on the considerations discussed above, that (1) there is reasonable assurance that the health and safety of the public will not be endangered by operation in the proposed manner, and (2) such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations, and the issuance of the amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public.
