Gentlemen:

This refers to the enforcement conference held on April 8, 1988 between our respective organizations. A discussion was held concerning your written response dated March 7, 1988 to the Notice of Violation dated February 12, 1988, the current status of your licensed program, NRC enforcement options, NRC concerns for the adequacy of your Radiation Safety Program and the status of your efforts to decontaminate the crawl space below the Engineering Sciences Building. Below is a summary of the actions we understand you will take in response to the meeting:

- Within 30 days, you will submit to the NRC a new written response to the Notice of Violation dated February 12, 1988. This response should include short term a tions completed, including dates of completion, and long term corrective actions planned (including dates) to preclude repetitive violations. These long term plans should include the management control systems which you described during our meeting.
- 2. Within 7 days, submit to the Region III Licensing Section a list of all authorized users of byproduct material and their qualifications as well as a list of radioactive materials and possession limits to be listed on your modified license. As agreed, the license will then be modified to a limited scope program.
- Upon receipt of your modified license, submit to this office within 60 days a revised license renewal application for a limited academic program as discussed with Mr. J. Madera of my staff.
- 4. Submit to the State of Ohio with a copy to this office, within 30 days, your action plan for assessing potential radiation exposure to individuals who may have been exposed to the radioactive material stored in the crawl space of the Engineering Sciences Building. The plan shall address your procedure for identifying such individuals, a determination of potential exposure, and provisions for testing of such individuals. We suggested that you consider whole body counting as a part of your planned testing.

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
