We have determined that the NRC has no additional records subject to your requests. For your information, copies of 22 records which had been previously identified by the staff as subject to your requests had not been provided to the FOIA office. In attempting to gather those records, the FOIA office discovered that the staff person in Region III who participated in the Diablo Canyon Task Force and who had gathered the records had discarded them with the passage of time without knowledge that he had the only copies. Lastly, one other record previously identified as a staff motion dated March 15, 1984, before the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board could not be located. It is our belief that this was a draft motion that was never filed before the Board because the Board has no record of this motion and staff counsel cannot find a copy of this motion.
