

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PART II B - APPLICABLE FOIA EXEMPTIONS

Records subject to the request that are described in the enclosed Appendices D are being withheld in their entirety or in part under FOIA Exemptions and for the reasons set forth below pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552(b) and 10 CFR 9.5(a) of NRC Regulations.

- 1 The withheld information is properly classified pursuant to Executive Order 12356 (EXEMPTION 1)
- 2 The withheld information relates solely to the internal personnel rules and procedures of NRC (EXEMPTION 2)
- 3 The withheld information is specifically exempted from public disclosure by statute indicated (EXEMPTION 3):
 - Section 141-145 of the Atomic Energy Act which prohibits the disclosure of Restricted Data or Formerly Restricted Data (42 U.S.C. 2161-2166)
 - Section 147 of the Atomic Energy Act which prohibits the disclosure of Unclassified Safeguard Information (42 U.S.C. 2167)
- 4 The withheld information is a trade secret or commercial or financial information that is being withheld for the reasons indicated (EXEMPTION 4)

- The information is considered to be confidential business (proprietary) information
- The information is considered to be proprietary information pursuant to 10 CFR 2.790(d)(1)
- The information was submitted and received in confidence from a foreign source pursuant to 10 CFR 2.790(d)(2)

X 5 The withheld information consists of interagency or intraagency records that are not available through discovery during litigation. Disclosure of predecisional information would tend to inhibit the open and frank exchange of ideas essential to the deliberative process. Where records are withheld in their entirety, the facts are inextricably intertwined with the predecisional information. There also are no reasonably segregable factual materials because the release of the facts would permit an indirect inquiry into the predecisional process of the agency. (EXEMPTION 5)

6 The withheld information is exempted from public disclosure because its disclosure would result in a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy (EXEMPTION 6)

7 The withheld information consists of investigatory records compiled for law enforcement purposes and is being withheld for the reasons indicated (EXEMPTION 7)

- Disclosure would interfere with an enforcement proceeding because it could reveal the scope, direction, and focus of enforcement efforts, and thus could possibly allow them to take action to shield potential wrongdoing or a violation of NRC requirements from investigators (EXEMPTION 7(A))
- Disclosure would constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy (EXEMPTION 7(C))
- This information consists of names of individuals and other information the disclosure of which would reveal identities of confidential sources (EXEMPTION 7(D))

Gentlemen:

On behalf of our client, Suffolk County, Long Island, New York, we request, pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, as amended, 5 U.S.C. Section 552 ("FOIA"), and the rules of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC") issued thereunder, 10 C.F.R. Part 9, copies of any agency records in the possession or control of the NRC relating to the following:

1. All records, including preparatory materials, contemporaneous notes, post-meeting discussions or analyses, and information submitted by the Long Island Lighting Company ("LILCO"), relating in any way to a January 14, 1988, meeting involving NRC employees, officials, agents or representatives (including Messrs. Reis, Johnson, Scoto, and Olmstead) and representatives of LILCO (Messrs. Earley, Frielicher, Reveley, and Irwin) concerning matters relating to the Shoreham Nuclear Power Station.

2. All records, not served via the service list in 50-322-OL-03, 05, or 06 dockets, relating in any way to any other communications during the period March 1987 to the present between LILCO, including any person acting for or on behalf of LILCO, and NRC employees, officials, agents or representatives, which concerned any matters pertaining to the Shoreham Nuclear Power Station, including without limitation, LILCO's request to operate Shoreham at 25 percent power, any Federal Emergency Management Agency review of revisions to LILCO's emergency plan,

any further exercise of LILCO's emergency plan, and any proposed procedures or schedules for any review or exercise of LILCO's emergency plan.


In the event that access is denied to any of the records responsive to this request, please supply the following information:

- c. Supply a detailed statement of the content of the withheld document or portion thereof, along with the date on which that document or portion thereof was written; its section heading or title; and an identification of any persons or entities who have received copies of such records or portions thereof, as required by applicable case law. Vaughn v. Rosen, 484 F.2d 820, 826-827 (D.C. Cir. 1973).
- d. Separately state your reasons for not invoking your discretionary power to release the allegedly exempt records or portions thereof.

The undersigned will pay charges for search time and copying fees, as provided by NRC regulations, 10 C.F.R. Section 9.14.
