Norelius, NRC, to Murray R. Edelman, The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company, concerning allegations about improper work done by Metalweld Inc., at the Perry nuclear power plant. The requested enclosure is an investigatory record compiled for law enforcement purposes and is being withheld from public disclosure pursuant to Exemption 7(A) of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. 552(b)(7)(A)) and 10 CFR 9.5(a)(7)(i) of the Commission's regulations because disclosure of the information would interfere with an ongoing investigation. Pursuant to 10 CFR 9.0 of the Commission's regulations, it has been determined that the information withheld is exempt from production or disclosure and that its production or disclosure is contrary to the public interest. The persons responsible for this denial are the undersigned and Mr. James G. Keppler, Regional Administrator, Region III. This denial may be appealed to the Commission's Executive Director for Operations within 30 days from the receipt of this letter. Region III has recently received anonymous allegations concerning activities associated with Metalweld Inc., a safety related coating contractor at the Perry Nuclear Power plant. These allegations were previously discussed with you during an October 25, 1985, telephone call between you and Messrs. R. C. Knop and C. H. Weil of our staff. Enclosure 1 is a description of the allegations received.

Due to the question of coating adequacy raised by the allegations provided in enclosure 1, Region III expects that Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company (CEI) will analyze the concerns; perform necessary audits, surveillances, or appropriate investigations in order to determine the validity and significance of the alleged conditions; and take appropriate actions as necessary in order to address both the specific concerns and root causes, if applicable.

We further request that the results of your review and disposition of these matters be submitted to Region III after completion. Documentation supporting your results should be maintained ensite for any further inspections by Region III. You should also be aware that the technical aspects of these allegations must be adequately resolved prior to fuel load.

The enclosures to this letter are being withheld from public disclosure in accordance with Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 2.790(a)(b) and (7).
