Mr. Bernero summarized his impression of Wissink's philosophy as presented in document GE001. Wissink is depending on protection in depth: (1) Short half-life of Po-210 (138 day) and one-year recycle by 3M; (2) microspheres are inert and of the right size (i.e., too large to be respirable and too small to be crushed under ordinary conditions); and (3) microspheres are stuck tight to the device.

No health hazard has been identified to date.

NMSS wants to concur in the letter to Battelle-Northwest concerning their use as a contractor to identify the cause of the problem.

3M has a competitor in NRD (Nuclear Radiation Development), a Mark IV Industries company. NRD's share of the business is quite small.
