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JOINT MOTION TO STAY PROCEEDINGS FOR ADDITIONAL 30 DAYS AND ORDER THEREON

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Intervenor, CITY OF BERKELEY, and Licensee, THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, (hereafter "moving parties") hereby jointly move for a stay of the proceedings herein, including intervenor's time to file a supplement to its Petition for Leave to Intervene, for an additional 30 days from the date of the previous stay Order herein, dated June 22, 1988. Moving parties stipulate as follows:

1. On March 10, 1988, the Commission published a Notice stating that it was considering issuance of orders to authorize Licensee to dispose of the component parts of the research reactor in its possession, at its Berkeley campus, in accordance

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with the Licensee's application dated January 8, 1988, and terminating the facility operating license number R-1-1. The Notice further stated that any person whose interest might be affected by this proceeding and who wished to participate as a party had to file a petition for leave to intervene by April 11, 1988.

- 2. The City of Berkeley timely filed a "Petition to Intervene in License Amendment Proceeding, Request for Hearings and Further Relief" and, pursuant to the Order of the Licensing Board, was allowed to intervene on May 25, 1988.
- 3. Said Order provided that the Intervenor was to file a supplement to its Petition to Intervene, which must include a list of the contentions which the Intervenor wished to have litigated in this matter within thirty (30) days of said Order.
- 4. The University of California wishes to have this matter resolved, by settlement if possible, and has communicated this desire to the Intervenor.
- 5. Intervenor was prepared to file a supplement to its
  Petition to Intervene on or before June 24, 1988, as provided in
  the Licensing Board's Order, but believed it was in the
  Intervenor's best interests to pursue settlement of this matter
  and so stipulated to a 90-day Stay of Proceedings which was
  ordered by this board on June 22, 1988.

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- 6. The moving parties agree that the best interests of the Licensee and the Intervenor will be served by pursuing such discussions in order to resolve the issues.
- 7. Moving parties have continued their settlement discussions throughout the 90 day period but now find that an additional thirty (30) days are necessary in order to include further public and institutional input, and to finalize a settlement agreement. Moving parties represent that they believe this matter can be settled within the thirty (30) days requested.
- 8. In the event a settlement is not achieved, Intervenor's supplement to its Petition shall be served and filed thirty (30) days from the date the Order on this joint motion is executed or within thirty (30) days of written notice from Licensee's counsel to Intervenor's counsel reinstating the time limits otherwise applicable, whichever first occurs. The service and filing of the supplement to the Petition for Leave to Intervene listing Intervenor's contentions, either upon written notice by Licensee's counsel or, in the absence thereof, in Intervenor's discretion, shall serve to dissolve the stay of proceedings and to reinstate all time limits which are otherwise applicable including, but not limited to, the time period for Licensee and the staff to file their answers.
- 9. Moving parties represent that the Commission staff has been advised of this Stipulation and Joint Motion to Stay
