# Seabrook Station Seal Entrapments—September 21, 1998

North Atlantic Energy Service Corporation (North Atlantic) hereby reports the entrapment of two seals at Seabrook Station. The seals were observed in Seabrook Station's Circulating Water System Pumphouse and were recovered the same day. North Atlantic notified the National Marine Fisheries Service of this entrapment incident by telephone<sup>1</sup>. The New England Aquarium performed necropsies on the seals.

This report is made in response to the National Marine Fisheries Service letter dated January 5, 1995<sup>2</sup>, recommending that North Atlantic report seal entrapment incidents. The attached seal entrapment incident report is enclosed as requested.

North Atlantic submitted an application for a Small Take Exemption Permit on June 13, 1997<sup>3</sup> for the incidental taking of seals pursuant to Section 101(a)(5)(A) of the Marine Mammal Protection Act and in accordance with 50 CFR 216.104.

# SEABROOK STATION SEAL ENTRAPMENT INCIDENT REPORT SEPTEMBER 21, 1998

Site of Entrapments and Date of Identification:

Circulating Water System Pumphouse Forebay on September 21, 1998.

Date of Recovery

Seals recovered on September 21, 1998.

Species Identification:

Harbor seals

Description/Condition of Seal

Seal 1: Young-of-the-year female, 45 lbs. and 94 cm long. Moderately decomposed. Appears to be in fair body condition. Stomach contained recently ingested fish including otoliths (ear bones) of red hake. Condition consistent with entrapment during feeding.

Seal 2: Robust Juvenile male, 90 lbs. and 124 cm. long. Moderately decomposed. Stomach contained recently ingested fish including 8 intact 6 in. herring.

Last Seal Observation:

A young-of-the-yearharbor seal was recovered on September 12, 1998. An incident report was submitted to the NMFS<sup>4</sup>.

Recent Fish Impingement:

Seal 1: About 20 fish were impinged during the week prior to estimated date of entrapment, including sea raven, rock gunnel, red hake and pipefish.

Seal 2: About 50 fish were impinged during the week prior to estimated date of entrapment, including pollock, rock gunnel, smelt, cunner and pipefish.

Cooling Water Intake Temperature at Approximate Time of Entrapments:

52°F

Plant Power Level at Time of Entrapment:

Seabrook Station was operating at 100 percent.
