The purpose of this letter is to notify you of a recent action taken by the Southeast Compact Commission and to request your assistance in notifying the appropriate persons.

On January 17, 1986 the Commission placed a limited ban on the exportation of low-level radioactive waste generated in the Southeast Compact party states. Effective March 1, 1986, waste must not be exported outside the region for disposal if (1) it meets the licensing requirements of the regional facility (Barnwell) or (2) it could meet such requirements through processing by available methods.

Please assist us in notifying the appropriate persons regarding this new policy. We have asked the eight state agencies responsible for licensing the use of radioactive materials in the region to inform their generators of Tow-level radioactive waste. A similar request was also made of Chem-Nuclear Systems, Inc.
