M. MOYNTHAN (for himself and Mr. Javits) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

## A BILL

- To authorize the Department of Energy to carry out a highlevel liquid nuclear waste management demonstration project at the Western New York Service Center in West Valley, New York.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 That this Act may be cited as the "West Valley Demonstra-
  - 4 tion Project Act".
  - 5 SEC. 2. (a) The Secretary of Energy (hereinafter in this
  - 6 Act referred to as the "Secretary") shall carry out, in accord-
  - 7 ance with the provisions of this Act, a high-level liquid nu-

1	clear waste management demonstration project at the West-
2	ern New York Service Center in West Valley, New York
3	(hereinafter referred to as "the project"). The Secretary shall
4	carry out the project by vitrifying the high-level liquid
5	nuclear wastes located at such Center or by employing the
6	most effective technology for solidification available. The
7	Secretary shall, as part of the project, also (1) as soon as
8	feasible transport such solidified wastes, in accordance with
9	applicable provisions of law, to an appropriate Federal re-
10	pository for long term burial, and (2) decontaminate and de-
11	commission facilities, materials, and hardware used in con-
12	nection with the project.
13	(b) During the fiscal year ending September 30, 1980,
4	the Secretary shall—
15	(1) prepare a plan for safe removal of such wastes
16	from tank numbered 8D-2 and any other storage tank
17	at the Center containing such wastes including safely
18	breaching the tanks, operating waste removal equip-
9	ment, and sluicing techniques,
09	(2) determine the feasibility of immobilization and
7	Waste handling techniques required by the unique situ

(2) determine the feasibility of immobilization and waste handling techniques required by the unique situation of such wastes at the Center, including initiation of detailed engineering and cost estimates as well as safety analyses and environmental impact analyses, and

(3) title to the high level liquid wastes at the Center shall be transferred to the United States upon @ 2 2 payment by the State of New York and other appropri-3 ate persons of an appropriate fee, as determined by the Secretary, for the perpetual care and maintenance of 5 such wastes. 6 SEC. 3. There is authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary not more than \$5,000,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1980, for the project. Funds authorized and appropriated in subsequent fiscal years for the project shall not be used by the Secretary for such purpose until the Secretary, the State of New York, and other appropriate persons enter into such contracts and agreements as may be required-14 (a) to provide for the transfer of title of such 15 wastes and the payment therefor, 16 (b) to enable the Secretary to utilize property and 17 facilities at the Center for the project, 18 (c) to share the costs of the project, except that 19 the non-Federal share of such costs shall be limited to 20 no more than 10 per centum thereof and in determin-21 ing such share the Secretary shall consider the utiliza-22 tion of such Center by the Secretary for the project, 23 the amount of money in the existing perpetual care 24 fund originally designated to provide, for ultimate dis-25

2	Center, and such other factors as the Secretary deems
3	appropriate, and .
4	(d) to otherwise provide for the conduct of the
5	project in a timely manner.
6	SEC. 4. In carrying out the project, the Secretary shall
7	consult with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, the Ad-
8	ministrator of the Environmental Protection Agency, the
9	Secretary of Transportation, the Director of the Geological
10	Survey, the State of New York, and the commerical operator
11	of the Center.
12	SEC. 5. Not later than February 1, 1981, and on Febru-
13	ary 1 of each calendar year thereafter during the term of the
14	project, the Secretary shall transmit to the Committee on
15	Science and Technology, the Committee on Interior and In-
16	sular Affairs, and the Committee on Interstate and Foreign
17	Commerce of the House of Representatives and the Commit-
18	tee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate an up-to-
19	date report containing a detailed description of the activities
20	of the Secretary in carrying out the project, including the
21	costs incurred, and the activities to be taken in the next fiscal
22	year and the costs thereof. Any contract or agreement ex-
23	ecuted under section 3 of this Act, together with summaries
24	thereof, shall be promptly transmitted to such committees for
25	their information and review.

SEC. 6. Other than the costs and responsibilities established by this Act for the project, nothing in this Act shall be construed as affecting any rights, obligations, or liabilities of the commercial operator of the Center, the State of New York, or any person, as is appropriate, arising under the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 or under any other law, contract, or agreement for the operation, maintenance, or deconsamination of any facilities or property at the Center or for any wastes at the other. Nothing in this Act shall be construed as affecting any applicable licensing requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 or the Energy Reorganization Act of 1974. The provisions of this Act shall not apply or be extended to any facilities or property at the Center

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14 which is not used in conducting the project.

Referred to the Committee on ---and ordered to be printed Ordered to lie on the table and to be printed INTENDED to be proposed by Senator McClure Page 3, line 1 to6, strike subsection 2(b)(3) and insert in lie thereof the following. "(3). Shall enter into a cooperative agreement with the State g of New York pursuant to "Federal Grant and Cooperative Agreement Act of 1977", Public Law 95-224, to provide for the conduct of the demonstration project without transfer of title to the high level liquid wastes or to the project site and for the following activities: (A) demonstration of vitrification technology or technologies which can be replicated for other applications in the United States: (B) submission jointly by the Department of Energy and the State of New York of an application for a licensing amendment 12 as soon as possible with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission allowing 13 for the demonstration: (C) application of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, 15 and the Energy Reorganization Act of 1974, as amended, to all aspects 16 of the demonstration project; and (D) conduct of other activities at the project, as determined to be appropriate by the Secretary, to protect public health and safety and to be in the national interest regarding the safe management of nuclear wastes in the United States.

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
