

#### CHANGE INSTRUCTIONS

Holders of the CR-3 Security Training and Qualification Plan, Revision 7.1 are recipients of Revision 8-0.

#### STATEMENT OF CHANGE

The currently approved CR-3 Security Training and Qualification Plan is Revision 7.1, effective date March 18, 1996. This submittal has been prepared pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 50.54(p) and will be effective upon signature approval by FPC Management.

### DESCRIPTION AND DISCUSSION OF CHANGES

Revision 8-0 of the CR-3 Security Training and Qualification Plan constitutes a major re-write consisting of numerous formatting changes throughout the document. All current commitments continue to be met as a result of this major revision.


#### JUSTIFICATION FOR CHANGES

10 CFR 50.54(p) evaluations and other supporting documentation for this revision are maintained in Security files.

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#### INTRODUCTION

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The Security Training and Qualification Plan (TQP) states the policies and 4 commitments of Florida Power Corporation (FPC) to the requirements of 10 5 CFR 73.55(b)(4) and Appendix B to 10 CFR Part 73, for Crystal River Unit 3 6 (CR-3). As such, it outlines the measures to be taken by FPC to assure 7 that members of the CR-3 Security Force are suitably trained, equipped and 8 qualified to perform their assigned Security duties to protect the Plant 9 against radiological sabotage as indicated by the threat level specified in 10 11 10 CFR 73.55(a). 12

The objective of the TQP is to provide a mechanism by which uniformed members of the Security Force can be trained, equipped and qualified to assure they will perform their duties and carry out their responsibilities in the most efficient and effective manner.

18 The CR-3 Director, Nuclear Site and Business Support is responsible for the 19 training and qualification of Security Force personnel. 20

The Manager, Nuclear Security (MNS), as a designee of the Director, Nuclear Site and Business Support, is responsible for the implementation of the entire CR-3 Security program to include implementation of this Plan.

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#### CHAPTER ONE

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#### EMPLOYMENT SUITABILITY AND QUALIFICATION 5 6 This Seccion outlines the suitability, physical and mental 7 requirements that shall be met by all uniformed members of the 8 CR-3 Security Force, and outlines documentation and 9 requalification requirements relating to such criteria. 10 1.1 11 SUITABILITY 12 Prior to assignment to the CR-3 Security Force an individual 13 14 shall, at a minimum, be declared fit for duty in accordance with 15 the CR-3 Physical Security Plan. 16 17 1.2 PHYSICAL AND MENTAL QUALIFICATIONS 18 19 The criteria indicated below shall be met prior to assignment to 20 the CR-3 Security Force. 21 22 1.2.1 Physical Qualifications 23 24 1.2.1.1 General Physical Qualifications 25 Individuals assigned to the Security Force shall have no physical 26 27 weaknesses or abnormalities that would adversely affect their performance of assigned Security Force duties. In addition, 28 Security supervisors shall observe members of the Security Force 29 for any indications of physical weaknesses or abnormalities which 30 may adversely affect daily job performance. 31 32 33 1.2.1.2 Physical Examination 34 Prior to assignment to the Security Force, all personnel shall: 35 36 37

Successfully pass a physical examination administered by a 0 licensed health professional with final determination being made by a licensed physician to verify that the applicant does meet the physical requirements delineated in this Section.

Drug screening and detection for drug abuse will be 0 completed by a certified urinalysis testing laboratory to determine Fitness-For-Duty.

When continued observation by Security supervisory personnel reveals a possible physical defect, the individual is referred to a licensed physician who verifies the presence or absence of such defect. All examinations provided under this Section are designed to measure physical ability to perform Security duties.

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### 1.2.1.3 Requirements for Armed Personnel

Armed Security personnel shall meet the following physical requirements:

#### Vision-

- o For each individual, distant visual acuity in each eye shall be correctable to 20/30 (Snellen or equivalent) in the better eye, and 20/40 in the other eye with eyeglasses or contact lenses. If uncorrected distance vision is not at least 20/40 in the better eye, the individual must carry an extra pair of corrective lenses.
- Near visual acuity, corrected or uncorrected, shall be at least 20/40 in the better eye. Field of vision must be at least 70° horizontal meridian in each eye.
- The ability to distinguish red, green and yellow colors is required. On-the-job evaluation is used for individuals who exhibit a mild color vision defect.
- o Loss of vision in one (1) eye is disqualifying.
- Glaucoma is disqualifying unless controlled by acceptable medical or surgical means, provided such medications do not cause undesirable side effects which adversely affect the individual's ability to perform assigned Security duties, and provided the visual acuity and field of vision requirements as stated above are met.
- The use of corrective eyeglasses or contact lenses shall not interfere with an individual's ability to effectively perform assigned Security duties. When corrective eyeglasses are required, they are to be safety glass or high impact safety type lenses.

#### Hearing-

- Individuals shall have no hearing loss in the better ear greater than thirty (30) decibels average at 500 Hz., 1000 Hz. and 2000 Hz. with no level greater than forty (40) decibels at any one (1) frequency [by ISO 389, "Standard Reference Zero for the Calibration of Purtone Audiometer" (1975), or ANSI S3.8 1969 (R 1973), "Specifications for Audiometers"].
- A hearing aid is acceptable provided suitable testing procedures demonstrate auditory acuity equivalent to the above stated requirements and its use shall not decrease the effective performance of the individual's assigned Security duties.

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#### Diseases-

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o Individuals shall have no established medical history, medical diagnosis or other medical condition which would affect their performance of assigned duties. Where such condition exists, the individual shall provide medical evidence that the condition can be controlled with proper medication so that the individual will not be affected while performing assigned Security duties.

#### Addiction-

- Individuals shall be tested to be drug free within the guidelines of 10 CFR Part 26 and have no established medical history or medical diagnosis of habitual alcoholism or drug addiction.
- In the event alcoholism or drug addiction has existed, the individual shall provide certified documentation of having completed a rehabilitation program which would give a reasonable degree of confidence that the individual would be capable of performing assigned Security duties.

#### Recovery From Incapacitation-

An individual who has been incapacitated due to serious illness, injury, disease or operation which could interfere with the effective performance of assigned Security duties shall, prior to resumption of such duties, provide medical evidence of recovery and ability to perform such Security duties.

### 1.2.2 Fitness-For-Duty

Members of the Security Force shall successfully participate in a Fitness-For-Duty Program that supports the requirements of 10 CFR Part 26. FPC's program is designed to ensure that all members of the Security Force are drug free and do not exhibit any alcohol dependence. This will be verified by a preemployment drug and alcohol test and be followed by an unannounced random drug and alcohol testing program.

- 1.2.3 Mental Qualifications
- 1.2.3.1 General Mental Qualifications

Individuals whose Security tasks and job duties are directly associated with the effective implementation of the CR-3 Physical Security Plan and the Safeguards Contingency Plan shall demonstrate prior to assignment:

- o Mental alertness.
- The capability to exercise good judgment.
- The ability to implement instructions.

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- The ability to assimilate assigned Security tasks.
- Possess the acuity of senses and ability of expression sufficient to permit accurate communication by written, spoken, audible, visible or other signals required by assigned duties.

#### 1.2.3.2 Professional Mental Examination

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Prior to assignment to the Security Force, personnel shall:

- Meet the requirements of the General Mental Examination sub-Section above.
- Have no emotional instability that would interfere with the effective performance of assigned Security duties. This determination shall be made by a psychologist or other person trained to identify emotional instability through an administered psychological test.

### 1.2.3.3 Continued Behavioral Observation

Security supervisory personnel observe members of the Security Force for indications of emotional instability in the course of performing assigned duties. Identification of emotional instability by a responsible Supervisor is subject to verification by a person trained to identify emotional instability through the use of an administered psychological test. In the event such test and examiner interpretation detects no conditions that would interfere with the performance of assigned Security duties, the individual is permitted to continue those duties.

### 1.3 PHYSICAL FITNESS QUALIFICATION

- 1.3.1 Prior to initial Security Force assignment, each individual shall
   demonstrate their physical fitness for Security related duties
   through performance of a practical, time phased Physical Fitness
   Test (Physical Agility).
- 41 1.4 <u>CONTRACT SECURITY PERSONNEL</u> 42
- 43 1.4.1 Contract personnel employed on the CR-3 Security Force are
   44 required to meet the suitability, physical and mental
   45 requirements appropriate to their assigned duties as delineated
   46 in this Plan.

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## 1.5 ANNUAL PHYSICAL REQUALIFICATION

23 1.5.1 At least annually, Security Force personnel shall pass a physical 4 examination that certifies each individual meets the requirements of the General Physical Qualifications Section of this Plan. 5 This physical examination shall be administered by a licensed 6 7 health professional with final determination being made by a licensed physician. Armed personnel must meet the Vision and 8 9 Hearing requirements as listed in the Armed Personnel Requirements Section of this Plan and the provisions of the 10 PHYSICAL FITNESS QUALIFICATION Section of this Plan at least 11 12 annually. 13

# 14 1.5.2 Requalification Following Absence

Members of the Security Force shall be subject to training and requalification following periods of absence as deemed appropriate by the Manager, Nuclear Security or designee.

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

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#### CHAPTER TWO

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#### 2.0 TRAINING AND QUALIFICATION

This Section outlines the program followed by CR-3 to ensure that all members of the Security Force are capable of performing their assigned duties during normal operations and contingency events.

#### 2.1 TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

12 2.1.1 Prior to assignment to the Security Force, each individual is
 13 trained to perform Tasks associated with their Duty Position.
 14 The training program includes an entry level module and an annual
 15 cycle of retraining/requalification. A program exiscs whereby
 16 observed deficiencies are corrected through retraining as needed.

#### 18 2.2 QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

2.2.1 Qualification requirements are to be met by all uniformed members
 of the Security Force. Non-uniformed members of the Contractor's
 Staff are not required to be certified. A CRUCIAL TASK/DUTY
 MATRIX follows which shows which Tasks/Duties must be performed
 by each Duty Position listed.

#### 26 2.3 TASKS, CONDITIONS AND STANDARDS

28 2.3.1 A TASKS, CONDITIONS AND STANDARDS Section follows which describes 29 the criteria upon which the CR-3 Security Training and 30 Qualification Program and Plan are based. Prior to assignment on 31 the Security Force, and at least annually thereafter, individuals 32 must qualify by demonstrating proficiency under the Conditions specified in accordance with the individual's Duty Position. 33 Except for firearms requalification, and if operational needs 34 dictate, proficiency may be evaluated through simulation (verbal 35 and/or performance) methods which satisfy the intent of the 36 Conditions and Standards. 37



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
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5.1 Audits of this Plan and the program that it implements, shall be conducted in accordance with provisions delineated in the CR-3 Physical Security Plan.

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#### APPENDIX A

#### Terms & Definitions

The following terms and definitions apply to the CR-3 Security Force Training and Qualification Plan and Program:

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o Annually - Not less than once every twelve (12) month period.

O Crucial Task(s) - An act or series of acts performed by a member of the Security Force that produces a product or an achievable result crucial to the implementation of the CR-3 Physical Security or Safeguards Contingency Plans.

O Dim Light - Lighting that reflects actual on-site night conditions at a minimum of 0.2 foot-candles of illumination.

 Duty Position - Organizational elements within the Security Department that denote a general statement of a group or series of Tasks conducted within a single position. Examples include the Security Supervisors, Response Team Members, etc.

 Qualification - Demonstrated successful performance of a given Crucial Task by a member of the Security Force that meets the minimum Standards and stated Conditions for that Task.

 Alarm Station Operator - A uniformed, armed member of the Security Force fully trained and qualified to perform assigned duties in accordance with the CR-3 Security Training and Qualification Plan primarily involving operation of the Plant Security Computer System (PSCS) and related equipment.

Security Officer - A uniformed, armed member of the Security Force, fully trained and qualified to perform assigned duties in accordance with the CR-3 Security Training and Qualification Plan to include patrols, alarm response and assessment, and compensatory posting. Security Officers may be referred to by one of their functional titles, such as Response Team Member.





Watchpersons may perform any Security Task not requiring a firearm.
