
# Seabrook Station Seal Entrapments—October 5, 8 and 10, 1998

North Atlantic Energy Service Corporation (North Atlantic) hereby reports the entrapment of three seals at Seabrook Station. Two of the three seals were observed in Seabrook Station's Circulating Water System Pumphouse Forebay and the third was removed from Circulating Water System screen wash debris. North Atlantic notified the National Marine Fisheries Service of this entrapment incident by telephone<sup>1</sup>. The New England Aquarium was notified to pickup the seal in order to perform necropsies on the seals in the near future.

This report is made in response to the National Marine Fisheries Service letter dated January 5, 1995<sup>2</sup>, recommending that North Atlantic report seal entrapment incidents. The attached seal entrapment incident report is enclosed as requested.

North Atlantic submitted an application for a Small Take Exemption Permit on June 13,  $1997^3$  for the incidental taking of seals pursuant to Section 101(a)(5)(A) of the Marine Mammal Protection Act and in accordance with 50 CFR 216.104.

Recent Fish Impingement: Seal 1: About 70 fish were impinged in the five days since the previous screen wash including 49 rock gunnel, 6 cunner and 3 pollock. Seal 2: About 60 fish were impinged in the two screen wash during the previous three days including 35 rock gunnel and 8 cunner. Seal 3: About 210 fish were impinged in the two days since the previous screen wash including 118 rock gunnel, 41 cunner and 18 sea snail. Cooling Water Intake Temperature at Approximate Time of Entrapments: 48°F Plant Power Level at Time of Seabrook Station was operating at 100 percent. Entrapment:
